

Legacy General Education Program Important Notes

Applies to students enrolled Spring 2019 and prior

- **Courses that will be phased out** -- make sure your advisees prioritize these courses if they have not yet fulfilled the requirement.
 - E120: English Composition has been redesigned into E130: First-Year Writing. Upperclassmen who still need to fulfill their E120 requirement should take E130. If students transferred in an equivalent course/AP credits, that also satisfies the requirement.
 - E220: Argumentative and Research Writing
 - one final section in the spring
 - COM101: Public Speaking
 - 2 sections this spring
 - ID160: Artscore
 - 4 sections this spring
 - Faith Traditions I (TH112-TH115)
 - TH112: History of the Bible - 2 sections this spring
 - LCT225: Perspectives on the Good Human Life
 - 5 sections this spring
- **Natural Science Requirement**
 - B110/B111: Botany and Zoology I with Lab and B120/B121: Botany and Zoology II with Lab have been redesigned into General Biology I, II, and III.
 - General Biology I, II, and III **do not** satisfy the Natural Science (NS) general education requirement.
 - B105: Environmental Biology is now a free standing lecture course that still satisfies the NS requirement.
 - B150: Biological Connections is a new course that satisfies the NS requirement.
 - B221: Biology Field Experience and B223: Biology Laboratory Experience are new lab courses that can be paired with any Biology course. For example, if a student needs to satisfy their NS with lab requirement, they can take B300: Current Scientific Issues with the B221 lab. OR they may take B150: Biological Connections with the B221 lab, etc. If a student already satisfied their NS with lab but still need a non-lab, they can take B105: Environmental Biology as there is no longer a lab connected to the course. Students cannot take the B221 or B223 lab courses without also taking a lecture course (the labs are not free standing).
 - If a student has not yet satisfied any of their NS requirements, it is preferred they take a lab first.
