Notes and Reminders

- I. Midterm grades – Due Friday, October 19th
 - a. Review midterm grades with your advisees. It is important they understand how their final grades can impact the courses they are considering for spring and that they are meeting prerequisites.
- II. Withdraw Deadline - Monday, November 19th
 - a. Remind students considering course withdrawal to check-in with financial aid. If they drop below 12 credits, they need to speak with housing and athletics if applicable.
- III. If a student fails or withdraws from FYE101: Anchor course the next retake option is Fall 2019
 - a. Student can take any FYE101 coded course, so if they are in FYE101A (B109) Environmental and Human Health, they can take FYE101C (COM108) Sport Communication as a retake option to replace a grade.
- IV. Advising Notes
 - a. Record thorough academic notes that include the courses you recommend to your advisee. If you have any concerns or information you would like to note that is more personal, please submit an early alert. Students cannot see these notes. You and other advisers the student might be assigned to have access to view these notes.
- V. Holds
 - a. Remind students to check holds in their portal by updating the term to SP19 College and clicking on 'Registration'. Holds preventing registration will pop-up.
 - Financial Holds:** see the Cardinal Central (Saint Mary's Hall 32)
 - Health Holds:** see the Wellness Center (Vlazny Hall 131)
 - Academic Holds:** see the Registrar's Office (Saint Mary's Hall 29)
